

HELLO AND WELCOME

- This Training Manual is an online training program that will guide you to your volunteer experience at This
 Old Horse. It will inform you about This Old Horse policies, procedures and expectations and help you to
 determine which volunteer role suits your interests and schedule.

- Please be mindful of your safety and others around you. Do not Interact directly with the horses If you feel It Is beyond your comfort level.

BE AWARE AND INFORMED

 Injury and death are possible when working with horses. You can decrease your risk of harm by staying focused, regularly seeking horse education and training, and by keeping up to date on This Old Horse policies, procedures and barn rules.

WAIVER AND INFORMED CONSENT

- Before your first shift begins, you must complete an Application, Acknowledgement and Acceptance of Waiver and Informed Consent and Acknowledgement and Acceptance of Stable Rules.
- Anyone entering the barn must sign a Waiver and Informed Consent and adhere to the Stable Rules.
- Volunteers should not hatter, handle, lead or Interact with a horse beyond their experience and comfort level. If a volunteer feels unsure or unsafe in any situation, they should notify the bam staff.
